

NOTICE OF ELECTION AND CALL FOR NOMINATIONS FOR ELECTION TO STUDENT LEADERSHIP POSITIONS IN 2025

1. Notice of Election

An election for the appointment of student leaders of the ACU National Student Association (ACUNSA) and the Campus Student Associations will commence on Wednesday 4 September 2024 and conclude at close of voting on Wednesday 2 October 2024. These elections will be conducted in accordance with [Statute 9 Student Organisations](#), the [Election Manual](#) and the Constitutions of ACUNSA and the Campus Student Associations. Further details regarding the positions available (including position descriptions), the nomination and voting process, and the Student Associations is accessible below.

2. Call for Nominations

5. Eligibility to Nominate and Vote

In general, any undergraduate, postgraduate coursework or postgraduate research student who is enrolled in an award course at the University is eligible to stand for office (nominate) and vote in the election of student leaders. Note, however, that many election categories are restricted to students who meet specific criteria (such as membership of a Campus Student Association). Further information regarding the electorates for specific positions is available below.

Students are permitted to nominate for up to three positions but, except as permitted under clause 26 of [Statute 9](#), a student may only hold one position at a time. Students who already hold elected student leadership positions in 2023 may be eligible to nominate for a second term of office (please consult Statute 9 and the Election Manual for specific advice if you are currently appointed and seek re-election).

6. Form of Nomination

Students must self-nominate using the [Nomination Form](#). The Call for Nominations will be sent at 10:00am AEST on Wednesday 4 September 2024.

As part of the nomination process, candidates are required to provide a biographical statement of not more than 250 words in support of their candidature in the appropriate section of the nomination portal. Candidates must also provide a suitable photograph to accompany the biographical statement. Both the statement and photo will be provided to the electorate as part of the ballot process to facilitate voting.

Completed nominations must be submitted no later than 4:00pm AEST on Wednesday 18 September 2024.
Nominations received after this date and time will not be accepted.

If more nominations are received than positions available, the appointment will proceed to a ballot as per the timeline stated above.

7. Membership of a Campus Student Association

To nominate for a student leadership position in ACUNSA or a Campus Student Association (CSA), students must be registered as members of the relevant Campus Student Association by close of nominations for the nomination to be valid. Any nomination for which the nominee is not a member of the appropriate Campus Student Association will be declared invalid.

Students participating in this election are required to read and adhere to the provisions of the [Election Manual](#) (which includes campaign guidelines).

9. Student Leadership Recognition

In accordance with clauses 35 to 39 of [Statute 9](#), ACU provides the President and Office Bearers of ACUNSA and of each Campus Student Association an *ex gratia* payment which is based on a set percentage of the Australian Government Research Training Program Stipend (base level) as follows: ACUNSA President 60%; other ACUNSA Office Bearers 30%; Campus Student Association Presidents 50%; and other Campus Student Association Executive Officers 25%. These Allowances are provided while the Student Leaders remain in office. Further information is available in [Statute 9](#).
